



Fourth Sunday in Lent March 10, 2024



Welcome | Grace + Peace is a gospel formed family for the city. Wherever you are in your spiritual journey, whether skeptical, curious, or a committed follower of Jesus Christ, there is room for you.

Nursery Nursery for children ages birth through 4 years old is available during the entire worship service. Babies and toddlers are in two separate rooms. To get to the nursery, you will exit out the back of the sanctuary and go through the glass double doors on the left. From there, you will walk down the ramp and take a right when you get to the end of the sidewalk. Enter through the double glass doors where you will find our Nursery Coordinator sitting at a table ready to check in your child and show you to their rooms. Children ages 0-2 will be in Room S102 and children ages 2-4 will be in room S101. Many parents choose to pick up their child just prior to communion for the last part of the worship service. This is a great way to introduce them to worshipping corporately. You may also opt to have your child remain in nursery for the duration of the service, as childcare is provided the entire time.

Family Room We have a room set up in Stedman Hall for families if you would like a more private place to comfort your babies. To get to the family room, you will exit out the back of the sanctuary and go through the glass double doors on the left. From there, you will walk down the ramp and take a right when you get to the end of the sidewalk. Enter through the double glass doors where you will find our Nursery Coordinator sitting at a table ready to direct you to the room which will also be marked with a sign. A live stream will be running so that you may continue to listen and participate in worship.

Children's Ministry | Children in Pre-K through 2nd grade are invited to attend our "Grapes + Peas" class. Children in Grapes + Peas participate in the first part of worship with their family, are dismissed during the sermon for a lesson, and return with their teachers to the sanctuary before communion. For first-time visitors, please escort your child with us to the classroom so we can introduce ourselves.

Discussion Questions

- 1. We see in this text Jesus is worthy to open the seals and reign, not through might but through His sacrificial death that also secures our place in reigning with Him. How can this encourage us to live according to His way rather than our own?
- 2. We reign with Christ even now, but because our reign is in Him, we must follow His way. For His family, this partly means reigning in unity and prayer. What obstacles do we allow to disrupt our unity? How can we best pray for and pursue unity in the church now?
- 3. Reigning in Christ's way also means following in His willingness to suffer and sacrifice for others. What kinds of sacrifices could help us reach our neighbors with the gospel? What is a sacrifice you could make (e.g. personal time, cost of a meal together, social status, etc.) that could create an opportunity to share the gospel with someone you know?
